Discussion Starter

Why is Paul writing this?



1. What does it mean to be 'dead' in our sins (v.1)? 5. What is meant by 'the flesh'?

2. Paul uses the past tense to describe our former way of life (v.2)? What assumption is he making here?

6. Paul speaks of death and life in v.5. How does the link to Christ's resurrection?

3. Who is the 'ruler of the kingdom of the air' (v.2)?

7. Why does Paul speak of God's grace in the 'ages to come'? Why not speak of the here and now?

4. Is Paul saying people are disobedient because Satan is at work in them, or that Satan takes advantage of those who disobey?

8. Why might Paul have had occasion to speak of God's gift of grace, and the elimination of boasting?

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How does this apply to or influence us today?

1. How do we view our own salvation? Do we really consider ourselves once dead, now alive?

2. What causes us to revisit our former way of life? What is the impact on ourselves and others?

3. The here and now is important, of course. But why is it also important to consider our eternal future?

4. Where does boasting come from? What form does it take?

5. What does it mean for us to be 'created in Christ Jesus'? What does this say about our salvation?

6. How does God go about preparing us for good works? Is it simply a list of tasks to fulfil, or something more?
